

Call for applications for the Dr. Alois Mock Science Prize 2025 and the Dr. Alois Mock Sponsorship Prizes 2025

Based on a cooperation with the Dr. Alois Mock-Europa-Stiftung (AMES), the Department for Legal Studies and International Relations and the European Documentation Centre of the University for Continuing Education KREMS award the **Dr. Alois Mock Science Prize** as well as two **Dr. Alois Mock Sponsorship Prizes** for the year **2025**.

In accordance with the statutory purpose of AMES as a non-profit foundation, the prizes to be awarded support scientific work that “serves to promote the idea of the peaceful integration of the peoples of Europe within the framework of pan-European institutions with the aim of securing lasting peace and prosperity in Europe”.

The criteria for the award of the prizes are:

1) Dr. Alois Mock Science Prize

- Target group: students and researchers
- Written scientific work (habilitation, dissertation, master thesis or similar) on a Europe-specific topic covered by the above-mentioned statutory purpose of AMES
- Submission of this work in the period between 01.01.2025 and 31.12.2025

Endowment: EUR 1.500,-

2) Dr. Alois Mock Sponsorship Prizes

- Target group: students
- Written scientific work (diploma, master, bachelor or similar thesis) with reference to Europe which contributes to the above-mentioned statutory purpose of AMES
- Submission of this work in the period between 01.01.2025 and 31.12.2025
- Consideration of social criteria

Endowment: 2 prizes of EUR 500,- each

Applications for the prizes are to be sent by e-mail to edz@donau-uni.ac.at by **31 March 2026** and have to include the following information:

- 1) Indication of the prize concerned: “Science Prize” or “Sponsorship Prize”
- 2) Topic of the scientific work and brief explanation how the work contributes to the achievement of the AMES statutory purpose
- 3) Name of the academic supervisor
- 4) When applying for the Dr. Alois Mock Sponsorship Prizes: brief statement of social criteria worth of consideration

The following **documents** (in electronic form) have to be attached to the application:

- 1) Scientific work
- 2) Assessment report and/or certificate including grades
- 3) Curriculum vitae (Europass CV recommended)

Incomplete applications can unfortunately not be taken into consideration.

An independent jury consisting of representatives of the Department for Legal Studies and International Relations and the European Documentation Centre decides on the awarding of the prizes. The jury's decision is final and cannot be appealed.

The winners will be informed in writing before the formal awarding of the prizes. The award winners' works will be sent to AMES, which reserves the right to publish the work.
